State Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP)

FUNDING: \$350,000 annually

- No funding received for 20/21 allocation
- 21/22 funding is \$464,214.00 an additional \$114,214.00





State Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP)



STRATEGIES:

- Purchase Assistance with/without Rehabilitation First Time Homebuyer
 - Moderate Income \$15,000 Low Income \$20,000 Very Low Income \$25,000
 - 10 Year Loans

Owner Occupied:

- <u>Rehabilitation</u> –\$50,000 10 Year Loans (62 or older 5 Year Loans)
- Demolition and Reconstruction \$150,000 15 Year Loans
- <u>Disaster Mitigation/Recovery Grant</u> \$20,000 No repayment
- Emergency Repair \$50,000 10 Year Loans







State Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP)



TERMS:

- Deferred loans secured by a recorded note and mortgage
- Interest Rate: <u>0%</u>
- Years in loan Term: <u>5, 10 & 15</u>
- Forgiveness: <u>5, 10 & 15% of the mortgage forgiven for each year</u>
 <u>they live in the home</u>
- · Repayment: No repayment as long as the terms or the loan are in
- good standing
- Default: <u>Due and payable if the event of sale, transfer, death or conveyance of property</u>




Eligibility

- Be within income limits
- · The home must be eligible
- One time assistance is available per person or per property except for disaster/mitigation relief
- Selection Criteria
 - Priority given to Special Needs persons or Disabled Veterans
 - Other households are on a first qualified, first approved basis



\$9.4 Million for Housing Replacement




- Received \$7.2 M in November 2019




STRATEGIES:

- Demolition and Reconstruction 15 Year Loans
 - \$175,000 for households of four or less
 - \$195,000 for households of five or more
- Rehabilitation –\$50,000 10 Year Loans
- Purchase Assistance with/without Rehab 10 Year Loans
 - \$55,000 Moderate

\$65,000 Low

\$75,000 Very Low

- Single Family New Construction \$180,000 Developer Loans per Unit
- Rental Development \$100,000 Developer Loans per Unit

Down Payment Assistance Programs

Florida Housing offers down payment and closing cost assistance in the form of a second mortgage loan The Florida Assist (FL Assist)

- •Offers up to \$10,000 on FHA, VA, USDA and Conventional Loans
- •0%, non-amortizing, deferred second mortgage
- Repayment is deferred

The Florida Homeownership Loan Program (FL HLP) Second Mortgage

- •Offers \$10,000
- •3% fully-amortizing, second mortgage
- •15-year term



- •Borrowers utilizing these down payment and closing cost programs receive 3%, 4% or 5% of the total loan amount in a forgivable second mortgage
- •This second mortgage is forgiven at 20% a year over its 5-year term



Makes homeownership affordable for eligible frontline community workers such as law enforcement officers, firefighters, educators, healthcare professionals, childcare employees, and active military or veterans.
