With 25 years of extensive experience in chambers of commerce and economic development across 32 states, she has already started implementing plans to promote both the Chamber and Jackson County. A Listening Session for Chamber Members is scheduled for June 13th at 11:30 am at RCC with Ms. Ekberg, Kelsi Jackson from the TDC, and Nikisha Milsap from Main Street Marianna. This session aims to gather feedback to shape the Chamber's strategic plan, enhancing support for its members, the business community, and the overall development of a thriving community for residents and businesses alike.

The New Orleans Mission (CHROME) has initiated discussions with the County to purchase three cottages on the Endeavor property in phases. The first, Bethune Cottage, will serve as a women's treatment facility for individuals recovering from addiction.

CHROME's commitment to providing a supportive environment aligns with the County's mission to promote community health and well-being. The proposed sale of Bethune Cottage for \$85,000 is a significant step towards this shared vision. Both parties are finalizing a purchase and sale agreement, following the Board's approval of a memorandum of understanding (MOU) outlining the commitment and due diligence requirements.

On April 9, 2024, the Board awarded RFP 2324-19 to NW Florida LD, LLC (Rausch Coleman). The Board has since approved a Purchase and Sale Agreement for the property on Pooser Road, enabling Rausch Coleman to begin development for attainable housing. This partnership is expected to enhance community growth and provide much-needed affordable housing options for the workforce.
