Hurricane Helene – Jackson County Shelters

Jackson County, FL – Following an afternoon briefing with Jackson County Emergency Management, we have important updates regarding Hurricane Helene and local shelter options. The National Weather Service has placed Jackson County under a Hurricane Warning. While our area is expected to experience tropical storm force winds of approximately 50 mph and rainfall between 5 to 7 inches, the eastern half of the county may see hurricane-force winds. There is also an increased risk of tornadoes throughout Thursday. Residents in RVs or mobile homes are strongly encouraged by Emergency Management to evacuate to more stable structures for safety.

A **Special Needs Shelter** is planned to open at 9 a.m. on Thursday, September 26, at Marianna High School. This is intended for individuals who are medically dependent on power.

A **General Population Shelter** will also open at Marianna High School, anticipated to be operational at 11 a.m. on Thursday, September 26. Please note that no alcohol, illegal drugs, firearms, or pets will be permitted in the shelter.

Residents seeking shelter should bring the following items:

- Blankets, pillows, and sleeping bags
- Toiletries and personal items
- ID and any important documents
- Prescription medications and over-the-counter medications
- Non-perishable food for snacks
- Entertainment (books, tablets, games) for adults and children
- Special items for infants or elderly family members
- Battery-operated radios, flashlights, and extra batteries
